

27th NOVEMBER 2015 REJECTION IN SOLID ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION

CLINICAL TRANSPLANTATION DAY 2015

An increasing number of sensitized patients at high risk for rejection undergo solid organ transplantation. Moreover, even in low-risk categories the availability of new diagnostic tools and a heightened clinical awareness have increased the recognition of antibody and T-cell mediated rejections. Finally, the widespread use of protocol for calcineurin minimization in low-risk patients has somewhat stopped the historical trend towards reducing the rates of acute T-cell mediated rejection. Nonetheless, it is not always clear which strategies are best to prevent rejection development and how rejection episodes should be treated in low-risk, as opposed to high-risk, patients.

The Course provides a comprehensive overview on all aspects of rejection in solid organ transplantation, namely immunology and pathology of rejection, risk prediction, optimal organ allocation to prevent rejection, the most appropriate immunosuppressive regimens in the low and high risk patients, when to stop anti-rejection therapy.
